TOP 10 THINGS TO DO IN MADISON!

<p>State Street Historical Walk (107 State St.)</p> <p>Cost: \$5, cash only; Hours: Saturday, 10:00am</p>	<p>Sponsored by the Madison Trust for Historic Preservation, this summertime tour series explores one of the city's most notable thoroughfares. Guides direct interested folks along the street, pointing out intriguing architectural features and structures and regaling visitors with anecdotes about prominent citizens and past organizations that made the district what it is today. Tours begin at the House of Wisconsin Cheese and last about an hour. Reservations are not required.</p>
<p>Henry Vilas Zoo (702 S Randall Ave)</p> <p>Cost: FREE; Hours: Daily, 9:30am-5:00pm</p>	<p>Exhibits are easily managed in a few hours time, and include such animal mainstays as giraffes, primates, lions, camels, and tigers. You'll also find a reptile house, children's zoo (where little ones can feed the animals), penguin exhibit, and more.</p>
<p>The Arboretum (1207 Seminole Hwy, University of Wisconsin)</p> <p>Cost: FREE; Hours: Trails, 7:00am-10:00pm; Visitor Center, Mon-Fri 9:30am-4pm; Sat-Sun 12:30pm-4pm</p>	<p>Outdoor enthusiasts and nature lovers relish this stretch of preserved land. Spread across more than 1200 acres, the arboretum features a variety of terrains, including prairies, savannas, hardwood forests, evergreen forests, marshes, and ponds.</p>
<p>WI Historical Museum (30 N Carroll St., Capital Square)</p> <p>Cost: Adult, \$4; Child, \$3; Family, \$10; Hours: Tuesday-Saturday 9:00am-4:00pm</p>	<p>For an enlightening overview of Wisconsin and regional history, this museum can't be beat. Spread across four floors are a wealth of information on original Native Americans, fur-trading, immigration, the lumber industry, politics, domestic life, and prominent figures.</p>
<p>Madison's Children Museum (100 N. Hamilton St)</p> <p>Cost: Adult/Children \$7.95, Senior/Grandparents \$6.95;</p>	<p>If you're looking to spend quality time with your children, you've come to the right place! Hands-on exhibits and programs are designed to inspire lifelong learning through play, celebrating children's imaginations.</p>

<p>Memorial Union (800 Langdon St.) Cost: FREE; Hours: Sun-Wed 7am-midnight, Thurs-Sat 7am-1am</p>	<p>Situated right on Lake Mendota, with a huge terrace to have a soda, beer, lunch or dinner, ice cream, read, see a band, watch the sailboats cruise by, or people watch, it's one of the best places to visit in Madison.</p>
<p>Union South (1308 W. Dayton St.) Cost: Varies; Hours: Daily 7am-10pm</p>	<p>An addition of the Memorial Union, Union South (opened in April 2011) is fully equipped with a movie theatre, bowling alley, and various places to grab a bite to eat. You can take a yoga class or study in the Sun Garden. It is a great place to relax or get together with friends.</p>
<p>Vilas Park (702 South Randall Avenue) Cost: FREE; Hours: Open Daily</p>	<p>Located on the shores of Lake Wingra, this park includes the Henry Vilas Zoo, an arboretum and a popular scenic beach. Take a ride down the famous "shoe slide"!</p>
<p>Wisconsin State Capital (2 East Main Street) Cost: FREE; Hours: Monday-Friday 8:00am-6:00pm; Weekends 8:00am-4:00pm</p>	<p>The majestic Roman Renaissance-style State Capitol has the only granite dome in the U.S. and inside has over 40 different types of stone from around the world as well as murals and handmade furniture. Check out the beautiful views of the city and surrounding lakes from the observation deck.</p>
<p>Olbrich Botanical Gardens (3330 Atwood Avenue) Cost: Outdoor FREE, Indoor \$2; Hours: Daily 10am-4pm</p>	<p>One of Madison's most popular attractions, this oasis of green includes a sunken garden, perennial garden, rose garden, rock garden, herb garden, wildflower garden and a tropical conservatory.</p>
<p>Monona Terrace (One John Nolen Drive) Cost: FREE (\$3 Adult & \$2 Student) Tours available daily at 1:00pm; Hours: Daily 8:00am-5:00pm</p>	<p>The Monona Terrace Community and Convention Center opened its doors after nearly 60 years of debate. It was first designed by Wisconsin native and internationally renowned architect Frank Lloyd Wright in 1938 as a cultural, governmental and recreational building.</p>

GUEST INFORMATION AND GUIDELINES

Alcohol & Drugs

Possession or consumption of alcohol is prohibited in the residence halls. Illegal drugs are not permitted anywhere on the Edgewood campus and possession or use of such substances will result in immediate referral to the police. Residence Life staff does not keep or assume responsibility for any participant medications.

Smoking

We are pleased to offer a smoke-free environment in ALL of our campus buildings. Campus policy states smoking cannot occur within twenty feet of any building entrance.

Candles & Incense

Candles and incense are not to be burned at any time.

Bicycles & Rollerblades

Edgewood is in the heart of Madison—an exercise and bike-friendly city! Bicycles are welcomed on campus.

Mail

Any mail your conference participants receive must be clearly marked with your program title on it. It will be given to camp staff to distribute to participants. The mailing address should be as follows: 1000 Edgewood College Drive Madison, WI 53711

Check-In/Check-Out

Group check in is 5:00 pm, and group check out is 9:00am. Plans need to be made in advance through your group contact if you need to arrive earlier or later. Special arrangements are contingent upon room availability.

Stevie Residence Hall

Rooms vary from singles to triples. Stevie hall is set up suite-style with two rooms sharing a bathroom space. The bathroom space has two shower stalls, one toilet stall and four sinks. Rooms are cooled to maintain interior temperatures from 74-76 degrees during the summer as an energy saving method. Please bring a fan if you would like additional circulation and cooling.

Residence Hall and Linens

Each person staying in a room will have a single bed, a desk, a chair, and adequate dresser and closet space. Each bed will have a mattress pad, linens, blanket, pillow, soap, and a cup. These items must remain in the room. Your beds will be made and ready to sleep-in when you arrive on campus. Towel service is available Monday—Friday. If your camp is staying for an extended period of time bed linens will be changed once a week on a pre-arranged day.

Extra Supplies

If extra towels are needed for guests staying over a weekend, they must be requested. Extra soap, cups, linens (pillows, blankets), hangers, or other supplies will also need to be requested. There is no guarantee that extra supplies will be available.

Lounges

There are lounges in all buildings. We ask that these rooms not be used for meetings, as they are public spaces, and usually more than one group is using a hall. Lounges have Cable TV, couches, chairs, and tables. In addition, each building has a kitchenette with a microwave, range, refrigerator, sink and a vending machine.

REC Center

The REC, located in the Predolin Commons, has a pool table, ping-pong, air hockey, big screen television, wireless internet access, and comfortable lounge chairs for conference guests to use at their leisure.
